Attendance and Punctuality

- Students must be punctual for school and all school activities.
- Absenteeism must be justified by a medical certificate from a doctor.

Students commuting to school in private vehicles will alight at the Drop-off Point (Sheltered bus-bay area after the library) inside the school from 6.30 am – 7.30 am (Monday – Friday).

Parents are encouraged to ensure that your child is ready to disembark safely at the designated drop-off point and move off quickly after alighting your child to reduce traffic congestion. Parking is prohibited on the school premises.

Vehicles will not be allowed into the school premises during dismissal between 1.00p.m. and 2.00 p.m.

This is to ensure the safety and security of our students during dismissal time. The school bus drivers have designated times to drop off the students in the morning and to pick up the students during dismissal at the Bus Bay.

The service road adjacent to Side Gate 3 is a one lane road. Parents are to alight your child at the drop-off points at Blk 307 so as to enable your child to walk along the void deck to the zebra-crossing where road wardens will guide your child to Side Gate 3.

Students walking to school can enter the school using Gate 1 or Gate 3. The details of the opening hours for the various gates are given in the table above.

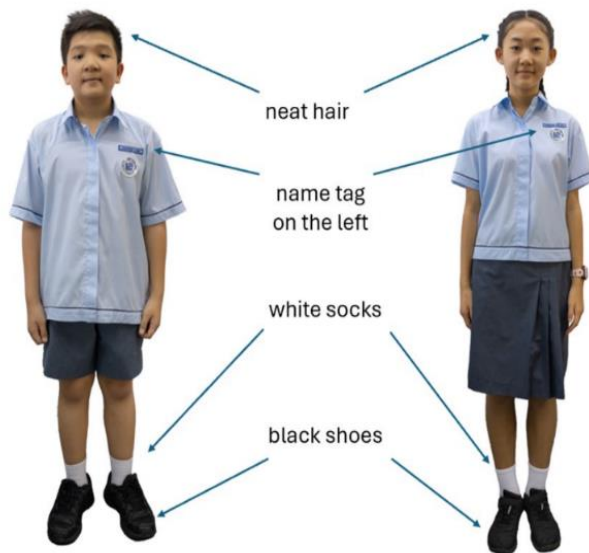

SCHOOL UNIFORM

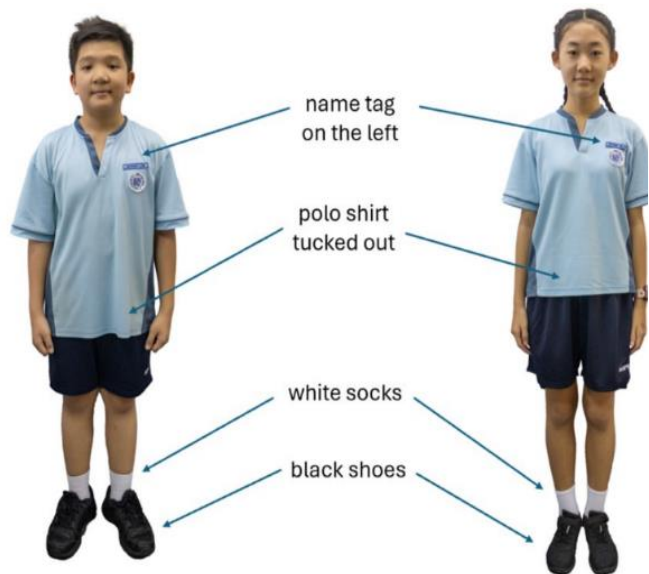

Your child will be issued a temporary name tag with a lanyard during the Orientation Day.

Please ensure that your child/ward puts on this lanyard for the first 2 weeks of school until his/her uniform name tags are ready.

MOBILE PHONES & SMART WATCHES POLICY

- The school does not encourage students to bring mobile phones to school.
- For the safety and security of students, smartwatches are not allowed, except for non-telecommunication ones (e.g., POSB Smart Buddy Watch).
- All mobile phones must be kept in bags during school hours; and may only be used after school in designated areas (near Gate 1 and Gate 3) to contact parents.

RECESS

Prepare a small wallet that can fit into the pocket easily.

- Suggested amount of pocket money is at least \$2.

You may pack food for your child/ward. Put the packed food in his/her bag.

- Label your child's/ward's personal items (e.g. wallet, lunch box, water bottle)

SNACK ITEMS

There will be a snack break at 11.00 a.m. Students will be allowed to have their snack in class during that time.

We seek your cooperation in packing healthy snacks (dry finger food) or fruits for the 15-minutes snack break and encouraging your child/children to take responsibility for the maintenance of the cleanliness of the classroom.

Parents/guardians are encouraged to look out for the Healthier Choice Symbol if your child is bringing packaged food products.

All students are encouraged to drink plain water so no flavoured drinks, including milk and milo, are allowed in the classroom.



To warmly welcome our P1 students on their first day of school, we're holding a special camp on 2nd January 2026, designed to help them transition into primary school with confidence. Only P1 students will attend, while P2–P6 students will remain at home.

The following Monday, 5th January 2026, marks the start of the "Start the Year Right" (STYR) programme, which will run until 7th January, where all levels (P1–P6) will engage in activities to build a positive school culture. During these three days, lessons are suspended to focus on holistic development, fostering good habits, and building relationships. STYR aims to nurture a sense of belonging, equip students with key competencies, and set a positive tone for the year ahead.

PREPARING YOUR CHILD FOR PRIMARY 1

Preparing your child for Primary 1 can be an exciting journey. Parents can play a critical role in helping your child prepare for this transition. Doing things like teaching your child life skills and familiarising your child to the new routine can support their transition with ease.








Some of the challenges faced by students entering primary school may include:

- Adapting to a new school environment with a larger class size.
- Making new friends
- Having to cope with longer school hours and new routines
- Learning to be more independent and adjust to a new phase of life

It takes time for children to get used to a new environment. As parents, it is important to provide space for our children so as to allow them to get used to the changes. Parents should also encourage your child and celebrate each milestone as they overcome challenges. Reassure your child that changes are normal. You can be a role model by being adaptable and flexible so that your child's anxieties or worries can be eased too.

Building Strong Foundations: Knowledge, Skills & Dispositions (KSDs) at the Start of P1

- The lower primary curriculum nurtures students' joy of learning, builds on pre-school foundations, and promotes dispositions and attitudes for lifelong learning.

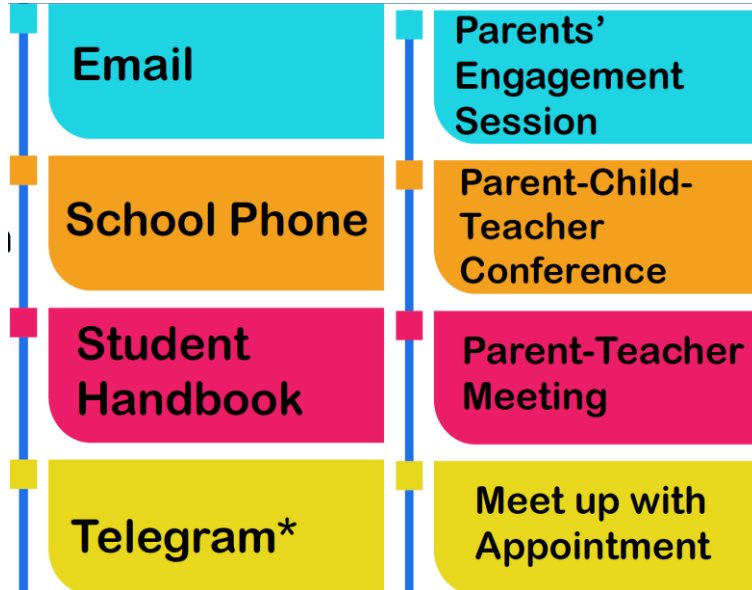

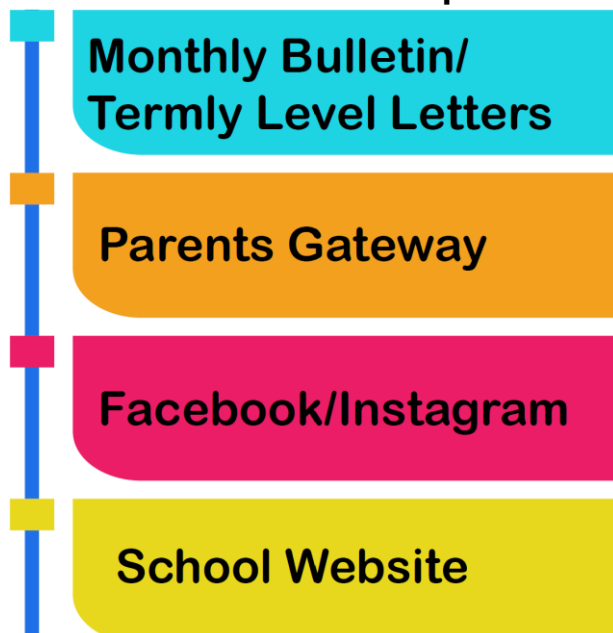
